They will also be staffed by a Police Constable in case a crime needs to be reported.


(The following advice has been taken from the MetPolice website under the Residential Burglary section of the Crime Prevention.)

Your home is only as secure as its weakest point of entry. That's why it's so important to have doors and windows that are as secure as possible. Here is where you'll find lots of helpful advice on how to keep potential burglars out.

Double secure

Simply shutting the door won't prevent burglaries. Double-lock the door every single time you leave the house.

Modern multi-locking and uPVC doors use a system of hooks and latches to secure the door but these only work if you lift up the handle and then remember to turn and remove the key. Remember – lift, lock and remove.
